To Know the Righteousness of the LORD

What does the Lord require of his people? He requires what is good: to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with our God (Micah 6:8). How is God my God? Through repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 20:21). The Lord wants us to know his righteousness; and, he gave us a reminder of it through Balak and Balaam (Micah 6:5).

Balak, king of Moab, sought to have God's people cursed. He saw what was done to the Amorites; and, Moab was afraid because the children of Israel were many. Balak had used Balaam to curse his enemies before, and he calls on Balaam once again. However, God will turn the words of Balaam into a blessing, giving us insight to God's righteousness along the way.

Three times Balaam blesses Israel: Numbers 23:7-10; Numbers 23:19-24; Numbers 24:3-9. Then, Balaam prophesies of the Star which shall come out of Jacob and the Sceptre that shall arise out of Israel (Numbers 24:17-19).

The first time Balaam speaks, it is of the righteous among Israel and their last end (Numbers 23:10; Revelation 20:4, 21:1). The third time, God reminds the world of what he promised Abraham: "Blessed is he that blesseth thee, and cursed is he that curseth thee" (Numbers 24:9; Genesis 12:2-3). It is in the second declaration of Balaam that we come to see the righteousness of the Lord upon believing Israel.

God sends a message to the world: he has not beheld iniquity in Jacob, neither has he seen perverseness in Israel (Numbers 23:21). How is that possible? God has given us the record of their wandering. The Lord gives us two reasons: first, the Lord his God is with him, and, second, there is the shout of a king (Christ) among them (Numbers 23:21b).

Israel, who believed the promise, were counted for the seed (Romans 9:6-8). The children of the promise are the children of God. Like them, we have received the promise of God through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Unlike them, we have the Spirit of Christ living within us, possessing the righteousness of God which is by faith of the Lord Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe (Romans 3:22).

The Lord our God is with us. He will never leave us, nor forsake us (Hebrews 13:5). We have more than the shout of a King in our midst: we have the Spirit of Christ, living within us (Romans 8:1-17). Our body has become the temple of God (1 Cor. 3:16).
