My Dad's MILITARY BIBLE

On December 26, 1942, my Dad was issued a pocket New Testament. It is the "National Edition of The New Testament of Our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST, conformable to the edition of 1611, commonly known as the Authorized or King James Version. Published by National Bible Press, Philadelphia, it was made especially for the Gideons. Chaplain C. E. Wilch signed this copy, given to John Louis Hughes.

President Franklin Delano Rossevelt wrote a letter dated January 25, 1941, to the Armed Forces. It is printed at the beginning of this New Testament, and reads as follows: As Commander-in-Chief I take pleasure in commending the reading of the Bible to all who serve in the armed forces of the United States. Throughout the centuries men of many faiths and diverse origins have found in the Sacred Book words of wisdom, counsel and inspiration. It is a fountain of strength and now, as always, an aid in attaining the highest aspirations of the human soul.

At the front of this "Sacred Book," the lyrics to several well-loved hymns have been printed. They include *Onward, Christian Soldiers; Jesus! Lover of My Soul; Rock of Ages; How Firm a Foundation; and, Nearer, My God to Thee.* Two patriotic songs are also present: *America* and *The Star-Spangled Banner*.

The Book of Psalms follows the New Testament. On the back flyleaf and endpaper are instructions on *How to Become a Christian*. *Come: Him that cometh to Me I will in no wise cast out* (John 6:37). *Receive: As many as received Him, to the gave He power to become the sons of God* (John 1:12). *Believe: He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life* (John 3:36).

Christ Forgives All Who Ask. All Sinners: For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Every Sin: The blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanseth us from all sin (1 John 1:7). How Justified: Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus (Romans 3:24). Instructions are included to confess Christ before men (Romans 10:9) and to trust Him daily.

Forty-eight years later, in 1990, my Dad followed those instructions. He bowed on his basement floor and received the Lord Jesus Christ as his Saviour!

The Council of Jerusalem, AD 50 -

Acts 15 records the first Church Council. The issue was with regard to salvation: Can a man be saved without circumcision or without the keeping of the Law of Moses – its sacrifices, holydays, dietary commands, etc. (Acts 15:5)? The Council concluded that such teaching was subversive (Acts 15:24).

Along the way to that decision, they declared the following: [1.] that the Gentiles should hear the word of the gospel and believe (Acts 15:7); that God gives them the Holy Ghost, even as he did unto the Jews (Acts 15:8); [2.] that the Lord put no difference between Jew and Gentile, purifying their hearts by faith (Acts 15:9); [3.] that the Gentiles shall be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, as were the Jews (Acts 15:11); [4.] that the Gentiles, as the Jews, abstain from pollutions of idols, from fornication, from things strangled and from blood (Acts 15:20); and [5.] that neither circumcision nor the keeping of the law of Moses were necessary for salvation (Acts 15:23-27).
