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Seven Things are an Abomination to God

These six things doth the LORD hate: yea, seven are an abomination unto him: a proud look, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood; an heart that deviseth wicked imaginations, feet that be swift in running to mischief, a false witness that speaketh lies, and he that soweth discord among brethren (Proverbs 6:16-19).

A man's pride shall bring him low: but honour shall uphold the humble in spirit (Proverbs 29:23). Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall (Proverbs 16:18). Cain is the first example of pride in Scripture (pride among men).

I say that because Cain walked away from God. Adam and Eve humbled their hearts and became obedient to the Lord and the offering he showed them. Abel followed in their steps, bringing to God of the firstlings of the flock. Cain had his own idea: he brought of the fruit of the ground (Genesis 4:3).

When God showed no respect unto Cain and to his offering, Cain became very wroth, and his countenance fell (Genesis 4:5). He had been shamed before his parents, before Abel, and before God. His pride kept Cain from doing well and being accepted of God.

Cain's pride led to contention with his brother. Pride always leads us to contention (Proverbs 13:10). Cain slew Abel. Why? Because Cain's works were evil, and his brother's righteous (1 John 3:12). Cain's works were in disobedience to God; Abel's works were in obedience to the Lord. The firstlings of the flock pointed to the Lamb of God. He takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29).

What made Cain's "works" evil? They denied God's offering and substituted man's opinion in its place. God's offering provides a covering for man's sin. Just as God made coats of skins for Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:21), he provides us "that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith" (Philippians 3:9).

This righteousness, God's righteousness, is by faith of Jesus Christ, unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference. All have sinned and come short of the glory of God, being justified freely by God's grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus (Romans 3:22-24).

THE IMPERATIVE MUST IN JOHN

The word, "must," appears in nine verses in John's Gospel: 3:7, 3:14, 3:30, 4:4, 4:24, 9:4, 10:16, 12:34 and 20:9. Three occur in the third chapter. (1.) Jesus declares to Nicodemus: Ye must be born again. (2.) The Lord follows that "must" with this: As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up.
