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Our Anointing is Christ's Spirit!

The Anointing which we have received of God (1 John 2:27) is the Holy Spirit with which we were sealed upon our belief of the word of truth: the gospel of our salvation (Ephesians 1:13). He is called the Holy Ghost (John 7:39), the Comforter (John 14:26), the Spirit of God and the Spirit of Christ (Romans 8:9).

We have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will (Ephesians 1:11). We have obtained that inheritance, having received the earnest of our inheritance (Ephesians 1:14) through belief of the word of truth, the gospel (Ephesians 1:13).

What was the counsel of God's own will? Is it not that we obtain an inheritance with Christ, an inheritance we will receive at the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of Christ's glory (Ephesians 1:14)? We will receive it, because the Father has done something: he has predestinated us to be conformed to the image of his Son, that Jesus might be the firstborn among many brethren (Romans 8:29).

Christ is the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he might have the preeminence (Colossians 1:18). We are foreknown of God (Romans 8:29): known of God before the possession of the inheritance, that is, before the literal, physical adoption of children for which we now wait (Romans 8:23).

We are predestined to the adoption of children because we have received the Spirit of adoption (Romans 8:15), which is the Spirit of Christ (Romans 8:9). Beloved, though it does not yet appear what we shall be, we are now the sons of God; and, we know that we shall be like him, when he shall appear, for we shall see him as he is (1 John 3:2). Every man that has this hope purifies himself, even as Christ is pure (1 John 3:3).

For this maturing, Paul makes three requests in his prayer for those who have trusted Christ as their Savior: first, that God may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Christ (Ephesians 1:17). We have the Holy Spirit. We are sealed by him. We now need our spirit to be a teachable spirit, before God the Father.

Second, that the eyes of your understanding be enlightened. We need to know the hope of his calling. We need to understand the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints (Ephesians 1:18). Third, that you grasp the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power, which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead (Ephesians 1:19-20). We can, by his Anointing.

God has promised us eternal life (1 John 2:25). And, because of our belief of the gospel (Ephesians 1:13), we have received of him the Holy Spirit, the anointing which abides in us (1 John 2:27). We need not that any man teach us: but, as the same anointing teaches us of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, ye shall abide in him [in Christ], even as it has taught you to abide in him.

We were convicted of the Holy Ghost, who taught us to trust in Jesus Christ. And, once we believed upon him, that same Spirit sealed us (Ephesians 1:13), moved in us (1 Corinthians 6:19) and made us a new creature (2 Corinthians 5:17). We became "born of God" in an instant.

God's Seed now remains in us, in whosoever is born of God (1 John 3:9). Who is that? Whosoever believes that Jesus is the Christ, he is born of God; and, everyone that loves him that begat us loves him also that is begotten of him (1 John 5:1). Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and, every one that loves is born of God and knows God (1 John 4:7).
