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Only GOD Can Forgive SINS!

Our Lord is in the house of Simon Peter, where Jesus had healed Peter's mother-inlaw of a fever (Matthew 8:14-15). Those seeking to hear him packed the house so, that the four who brought one taken with a palsy could not find any way to bring him into the house and unto the Lord. Consequently, they went upon the housetop and let him down, through the tiling, with his couch, into the midst, before Jesus (Luke 5:19).

Since this was Peter's home, Peter had to be one of the four carrying the man taken with a palsy. If so, James and John, the sons of Zebedee, would have been willing to help him, along with Peter's brother, Andrew. Again, if these are the four, Zebedee may have been the man stricken. To have Zebedee at full strength would be vital, seeing the four who helped him fish commercially were now following the Lord Jesus (Matthew 10:2).

Whoever the four men were, they were men of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus himself testifies to this truth. The Bible says, "Jesus, seeing their faith, said unto the sick of the palsy; 'Son, be of good cheer: thy sins be forgiven thee' (Matthew 9:2)."

The skeptical scribes, who only came to find fault with Jesus, said within themselves, "This man blasphemeth" (Matthew 9:3). They reasoned in their hearts, "Who can forgive sins but God only?" (Mark 2:6-7).

Immediately, when Jesus perceived in his spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, he said unto them, "Why reason ye these things in your hearts? Whether is it easier to say to the sick of the palsy, 'Thy sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Arise, and take up thy bed, and walk? But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy,) I say unto thee, Arise, and take up the bed, and go thy way into thine house" (Mark 2:8-11).

Without hesitation, the sick of the palsy arose, took up the bed and went forth before them all, to their amazement! And, they glorified God, saying, "We never saw it on this fashion" (Mark 2:12b).

Only God can forgive sins; and, Jesus Christ is God, in the flesh (John 1:1-17). He is the Christ, the Son of the living God (Matthew 16:16). Only the Father can reveal that truth (Matthew 16:17). And he chooses to do so through hearing the word of God: "So then faith cometh by hearing" (Romans 10:17). Are you listening to the gospel?
