Gratitude is the Right Attitude!

Gratitude is *the quality of being thankful; readiness to show appreciation for and to return kindness.* In a blog article entitled "Giving thanks can make you happier" (dated August 14, 2021, published by Harvard Health Publishing / Harvard Medical School). *Research (and common sense) suggests that one aspect of the Thanksgiving season can actually lift the spirits, and it's built right into the holiday – being grateful.*

The article continues: "The word *gratitude* is derived from the Latin word *gratia*, which means *grace*, *graciousness*, *or gratefulness*.... Gratitude helps people feel more positive emotions, relish good experiences, improve their health, deal with adversity, and build strong relationships."

In an article published by **The Brink**, pioneering research from Boston University, dated October 7, 2021, written by Jillian McKoy, entitled *Depression Rate in US Tripled When the Pandemic First Hit* — *Now, They're Even Worse*: the study found that the most significant predictors...were low household income, not being married, and experiencing multiple pandemic-related stressors. This was the first nationally representative study in the US that examines the change in depression prevalence before and then during the pandemic.

Depression is a reality. The Apostle Paul speaks of being *pressed out of measure*, *above strength, insomuch that we despaired even of life* (2 Corinthians 1:8). What kept them from taking their own lives? Paul testifies, *We had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raises the dead: who delivered us from so great a death, and does deliver: in whom we trust that he will yet deliver us* (2 Corinthians 1:9-10).

Paul opens Second Corinthians with praise: *Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God* (2 Corinthians 1:3-4).

There is power in giving God thanks: *Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name* (Psalm 100:4).
