TRUE THANKSGIVING

Think back. What made you truly thankful? Taking things for granted, treating people as though they owed you whatever it is they do for you – those things are easy. They come naturally. We were born that way. We are selfish, self-centered and arrogant when left to ourselves. It takes training, discipline and a change of heart to be truly thankful. That change comes from God's Spirit, who makes us a new creature in Christ.

In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln named the last Thursday in November a national holiday. Thanksgiving had already become an annual fall tradition. What hardships did the early Pilgrims face that forged a thankful heart?

They had set sail for the New World in September, 1620. Three months later, in late December of that year, they anchored at Plymouth Rock. "More than half the settlers fell ill and died that first winter, victims of an epidemic of disease that swept the new colony" [Harold M. Lambert/Kean, Plymouth Colony, History.com, December 18, 2009; updated June 27, 2023, (accessed 27-10-2023)]. Would survival make you thankful?

The Apostle Paul writes to young Timothy and declares the following: *This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into this world to save sinners; of whom I am chief* (1 Timothy 1:15). Jesus Christ saves sinners. People who know that they are sinners and who understand the penalty for their sin.

The Lord saves people who become grateful for their salvation. These are people who appreciate, from the depth of their hearts, the sacrifice he made on the cross. They are convicted people: convicted by the Spirit of God and the Word of God. Convicted of their conduct, their attitude, their anger, their lust, their lies, their laziness. They are convicted of their sin; and, they have willfully turned to Jesus Christ as their Savior.

Paul considered himself the chief of sinners. I think we all do. The fact that God saves sinners is faithful to the Old Testament, beginning with Adam and Eve and highlighted by God's reasoning with Cain (Genesis 4:5-7). This truth is worthy of all acceptation, for all of us are sinners. By Adam, sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and, so, death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned (Romans 5:12).

The good news: God saves sinners. Christ took the handwriting of ordinances that was against us and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross. Will you accept his gift?

God's Witnesses... Ye are my witnesses, saith the LORD, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I am he: before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me. I, even I, am the LORD; and beside me there is no saviour. I have declared, and have saved, and I have shewed, when there was no strange god among you: therefore ye are my witnesses, saith the LORD, that I am God (Isaiah 43:10-12).
